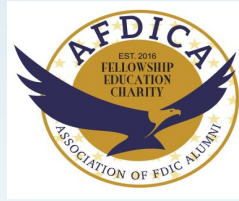
In 2018 the Charitable Services Committee raise \$10,000.00 and contributed:

JUMP\$TART WASHINGTON, D.C.



\$6,000 awarded to Jump\$Tart, a Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy. Jump\$Tart is based in Washington, D.C. As a coalition, Jump\$Tart unites organizations committed to advancing financial literacy among pre-school through college-age youth. FDIC is a partner with Jump\$Tart. Each year Jump\$Tart offers 18-21 hours of financial literacy training to teachers from around the country.

Funds donated will cover the registration cost for twelve teachers. Each teachers will use the financial literacy training for future instructions to their students in their class rooms.

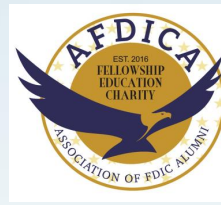
Three scholarships was awarded to students majoring in financial and economic studies.

City Harvest helped start the food rescue movement in 1982 when a group of New Yorkers saw that New York City had an abundance of excess food even while a large number of its residents struggled to feed themselves and their families. We recognized the practical purpose that this surplus food could serve if directed to New Yorkers who needed it, filling the plates of the working mom who had trouble making ends meet at month's end, the senior in the apartment upstairs living on a fixed income, or the family around the corner coping with a large and unexpected medical bill.

Today, City Harvest is New York City's largest food rescue organization, helping to feed the more than 1.2 million New Yorkers who are struggling to put meals on their tables. We will rescue 61 million pounds of food this year and deliver it, free of charge, to hundreds of food pantries, soup kitchens and other community partners across the five boroughs. City Harvest's programs help food-insecure New Yorkers access nutritious food that fits their needs and desires; increase our partners' capacity; and strengthen the local food system, building a path to a food-secure future for all New Yorkers.

Each local Habitat affiliate operates as an independent nonprofit organization, and in partnership with Habitat for Humanity International.

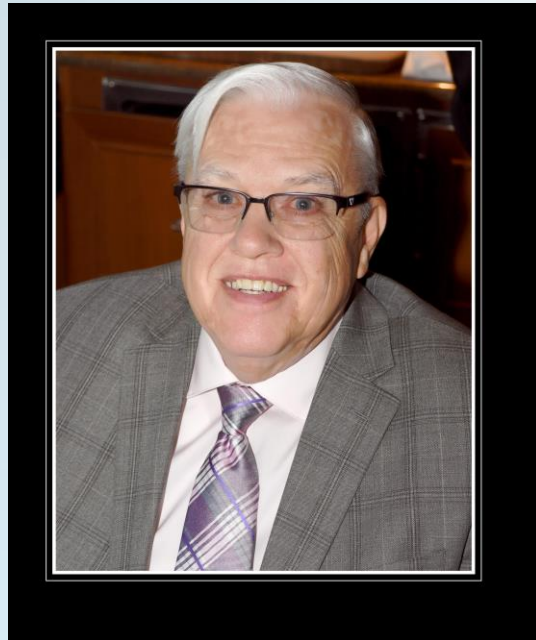

General Society of Mayflower Descendants *Founded in 1897*

In 1620, a brave group of 102 men, women and children sailed across the Atlantic on the *Mayflower*, searching for a life of religious and civic freedom. To honor Pilgrim ancestors and keep their story alive, the General Society of Mayflower Descendants was created in 1897. Membership requires proof of lineage from one of the passengers who traveled to America on this historic voyage in 1620.

More than one hundred years ago, a group of descendants of the Pilgrims who sailed on the *Mayflower* in 1620, saw the need for a national society to honor their memory. The intention was to remember these Pilgrims who established Plymouth Colony. The Mayflower Society established a network of more than 150,000 descendants all over the world. Today there are tens-of-millions of individuals descended from these brave souls.
